Best Practice -I

1. Title:

Distribution of masks and sanitizer and creating awareness to check COVID19 Infection during pandemic Period.

2. Objectives:

To provide information about spread of Covid-19 Infection during pandemic period.

To create awareness among people about taking precautionary measures during pandemic Period.

To make efforts for maintaining hygiene to check spread of Corona Infection.

3. Contest:

The college faculties distributed masks and sanitizer bottles in the nearby villages.

4. Practice:

Corona Virus outbreak was happened not only in India but also across the world. Many people lost their lives during KOVID19 Lockdown Period. Corona Virus infection caused mortality in every Indian village. The Centre and State Government implemented many schemes and policies to create awareness among people during the Pandemic Period. Government directed all vendors to keep social distance and follow corona related protocols in market places and social satiations. Corona Infection spreads from person to person through close contacts. Corona Virus enters a person's body through touch of a corona positive person. Therefore, people should keep social distance, clean hands, wear face masks, use sanitizer frequently while in market & social places. Under the auspices of NSS department, Students and teachers distributed free masks and sanitizers in nearby villages such as Dhanora, Shekapur Bai, Gangapur, Khapari, Kutki, Pohana etc. NSS volunteers and program officer provided masks; sanitizer bottles guided social workers a lot for checking spread of Corona Infection enthusiastically. Masks were stitched and sanitizer bottles were prepared by students and they visited people in their homes. Our College volunteers demonstrated use of masks, sanitizers and guided people on social distancing. Masks and sanitizers were distributed in a wedding function at Dhanora in a wedding function and guided them on social distancing.

5. Evidence of Success:

Pragati Wele stitched masks and NSS volunteers of Shri Saibaba Lok Prabodhan Arts College, worked in the vicinity villages of Wadner. Shubham Salve, Rajkumar Korewar, Pragati Vele, Sakshi Jawade, Nitu Gavankar, Arati Uike, Monali Bhagat rendered voluntary services. Prashant Tijore, Preetam Duff, Akash Chaudhari, Priyanka Tiple, Pallavi Tiple, Nitesh Joge and all other NSS volunteers and students actively participated and contributed a lot for inculcating awareness among people during pandemic period. They performed Street Plays and addressed Street Corner Meetings to generate awareness among people. It is observed that corona spread can be prevented by using such preventive items and following innovative practices undertaken by students of our college.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

In the beginning villagers were very much reluctant and did not give wholehearted response because of various phobias and wrong notions of the Corona Infections. Volunteers offered facemasks and sanitizer bottles to villagers but they preferred stay in homes. Most of the villagers did not take Corona Infection seriously in the beginning. Ignorant & superstitious rustic's chiefly tribal's had a belief that COVID19 is curse of a deity. They were more prone to follow religious rituals as perfect remedy of the Corona Infection. Phobias about Corona Virus, strong belief in Rituals and lack of transportation and medical facilities took heavy toll in the second wave of the Corona Virus Infection. Some teachers working as Corona Virus warriors became victims of corona infection during this period.

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Best Practice-II

1. Title:

Online Teaching Videos

2. Objectives:

To complete the prescribed syllabus by imparting education to students through online videos to students during pandemic period.

To prepare students for university exams.

3. Context:

All concerned faculty members of the college teaching staff prepared the teaching videos of their respective subjects based on prescribed syllabus. In turn they were uploaded on You Tube Channels and subject what's app groups to enable students to prepare themselves for taking university exams. Online class tests, annual tests and student seminars were conducted on Zoom platform.

4. Practice:

Government prohibited to run offline classroom teaching in schools and colleges due to corona pandemic situation since 22 March 2020 and issued related protocols and instructed academic institutions to follow the guidelines strictly. The government and the RTM Nagpur University advised colleges to conduct online classes in the academic year 2020-21. It was impossible for some students to attend online classes owing to poor network; so our college professors prepared their teaching videos of their respective subjects such as English, Marathi, Sociology, Economics, Political Science, History, English Literature, Marathi Literature, and Home Economics. Every teaching faculty member created Whats app group for his subject and uploaded the same videos for students during the Covid-19 pandemic situation. Our college faculty members began to prepare teaching videos on 07th July, 2020 and syllabus based teaching videos were recorded and provided to BA semesters 2, 4 and 6 students on subject Whatsapp groups. All these teaching videos proved of immense importance for students to prepare themselves for university exams. As many as 2440 teaching videos were prepared and uploaded on college You Tube Channel and subject what's app groups. Thus, all these teaching videos played very vital role in preparing students for the university level exams.

5. Success of the Teaching Videos:

220 students for BA Part One, 152 for Part two and 91 for Part Three were enrolled in respective classes in the college during the academic year 2020-21. Total number of enrolled students was 463. They

availed good benefit of these online teaching videos for their exam preparation and skill development. Students could achieve success in university exams because of all these syllabus based teaching videos.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Many students from rural areas didn't have android mobile phones and good consistent mobile network; therefore, they could not avail the benefit of such online teaching videos and classes and some of them failed in university exams.
